After a Moment of Silence and the Serenity Prayer, introductions were made: Dawn C. of Wed. night Butterfly AFG, Sue W., Jean F., Toni B., Charlene V., and Cindy A. of Monday night HOW, Jan R. and Hilary of Friday night Experience, Strength and Hope, Travis Y. of the Al-Anon/Alateen group on Thurs.-Progress not Perfection, and Ramona B. of Tues. What is "pyramid" or controlling sponsorship? (from Past Delegate, Betsy C.)

- Members belong to a sponsorship "family" with sponsors, grand sponsors and great grand sponsors – sometimes even tracing sponsorship family to an out-of-town AFG member. (Sometimes attendance at out-of-town special meetings is <u>required.</u>)
- 2. Meetings for this "family" are held in the members' homes to study the Big Book and it is by invitation only.
- 3. Members are asked to put away all CAL and study only the Big Book "for now."
- 4. Members are <u>assigned</u> to a sponsor and told how many they may sponsor.
- 5. Members are told that if they don't do what is "suggested," they will be fired.
- 6. Members are told how to vote at group business meetings, district and assembly meetings.
- 7. 4th step inventory must be done by the Big Book method and be shared with multiple people multiple times.
- 8. Members must get permission to participate in AFG functions such as speaker meetings.
- 9. Members are ostracized if they do not do what they are told or try to leave these groups.

Any or all of these behaviors **IS NOT** healthy sponsorship, violates trust and feeds on the defects of character that got us to Al-Anon. It attracts the lonely, desperate newcomers who don't feel wanted or needed by anyone! Our best defense is to **educate** and **educate** and **educate**. We need to **talk** and **talk** about this cult type of behavior to let members know this is WRONG and THIS IS NOT AL-ANON!

This information is included in some packets that contain FORUM articles and excerpts from Conference summaries about this problem, as well as ideas about how to expose and fight the spread of this behavior. It is important for all GR's to share this information with all members of your groups, especially newcomers who are vulnerable and desperate for direction. Anyone wanting to get out from under this controlling sponsorship will need lots of support. The packets will be available at the next Assembly meeting or by contacting past delegate, Paralea R. at 618-656-1635 or paralea@sbcglobal.net. Read our "Sponsorship What It's All About" pamphlet P-31 and stress loving guidance, not control/pressure in sponsorship.
